Early Years Basic Skills

A huge well done to our Early Years team, Governors and parents who have successfully led the school through another revalidation of the Early Years Basic Skills award. This marks the 3rd time, that the school have received this recognition. The report highlighted many strengths and we would like to share a few quotes with you that we are particularly proud of:

'The Early Years Foundation Stage team have set high and limitless opportunities for children to learn within their setting and the children are flourishing applying all of their basic skills though, and during, their play experiences.'

'High quality first teaching is evident and children's vocabulary, early
Mathematical and Literacy skills are stretched during appropriately
structured adult led sessions. Teaching staff all know their family group
members and can offer challenge and differentiation through clever
questioning and assessment processes. Children were observed applying their
knowledge and understanding during their play experiences.'

'The open door policy of the school has led to strong relationships with parents who can attend for a number of celebrations, workshops and projects and communicate that they understand their own child's learning and development and can support this in the home.'

The school have worked hard to move to an 'innovative learning and teaching approach' and it was recognised that 'the quality of the children's basic skills has improved'. We were pleased that our identified area of development was that 'the school should work towards disseminating this outstanding Early Years practice to schools and settings in the region and beyond.'

Online Safety

As part of the schools dedication to the United Nations Convention for the Rights of the Child and ongoing commitment to ensuring that children are becoming digital leaders of the future we have developed series of information and guides to help support parents further and provided them with the most up to date information for social media, apps and platforms that our children are using. The online world is fast becoming a complicated environment with so much innovation creating incredible opportunities for us all, but specifically for our children. It's so important we empower children to embrace these opportunities. The real world and the virtual world are both full of risks; we need to understand these risks so that we can teach our children how to recognise them and navigate around them.

We are planning to go live with the new system on Friday 11th January 2019, therefore, we kindly ask with those with outstanding balances to clear these by Wednesday 9th January 4pm. Anyone who has credit on their account or pre bookings for clubs, will not need to do anything as this will transfer over to the new system.

Please do not use School Gateway for any payments or bookings from Wednesday 9th January 2019 4pm.

You won't need to sign up to this system as this is done automatically through the school and we will send you a password on Friday 11th January 2019. This password will give you access to your SchoolMoney account where you can pay for any items we have requested from you.

To log into **SchoolMoney**, you will need your mobile number, email address and the password we have sent to you, therefore, please let us know immediately if either your mobile number or email address has changed recently.

We appreciate your cooperation in the early stages of rolling this system out to you.



Mobile Phones
