Physical Education Grant Expenditure: 2016/17

In Summer 2013, the Government announced that they will be providing funding for academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15. This was extended and is current to the academic year 2016/17. The funding is to be used by schools to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision in all schools, across the UK. We expect to receive £8,935 from the DfE as part of the Primary School Sport Funding for the academic year 2016-17. This continued funding has enabled us to sustain improvements in sport by building upon and enhancing skills previously developed as children move up through the school.

We are using the Sport Premium to improve the quality of PE and Sport provision in the following ways:
