School Safety

We have identified a potential safety risk to those children who arrive early and unaccompanied to the school grounds.

Parents are reminded that the school day begins at 8:55am, we operate a drop in policy and the school doors open at 8:45am until 8:55am, therefore reducing congestion around Moorside and allowing information to be shared between home and the school at the beginning of each day and to ensure children's welfare is given high priority. There have been some instances where children have been left unattended for up to 20 minutes before school doors open, often in inclement weather. We are asking that parents support us in keeping our children safe by aiming to arrive at school between the allocated drop off time.

OPAL

An exciting new journey lies ahead as we are beginning to develop our new OPAL curriculum across school.

The OPAL Outdoor Play and Learning Programme is the result of 17 years testing and development in over 250 schools and is now used in Canada and New Zealand as well as across the UK. Work has started to adapt the programme for schools in Slovakia, Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland and Austria. In 2018 OPAL won first prize in an EU funded award for the best active school's programme in Europe.

It is based on the idea that as well as learning through good teaching, your children also learn when they play, and as 20% of their time in school is playtime, we want to make sure that this amount of time (equivalent to 1.4 years of primary school) is as good as possible.

One reason the school is carrying out this programme is that childhood has changed and many children's play needs are no longer reaching the recommended requirement.

- Average screen time per day 5 hours
- Average outdoor play time per week 5 hours
- Percentage of UK children who only play outdoor with other children at school 56%

There are many proven benefits for school which carry out the OPAL Programme. They usually include: more enjoyment of school, less teaching time lost to disputes between children, less accidents and greatly improved behaviour.

This half term, we will be holding a talk from an OPAL leader who is coming into school to explain the benefits of OPAL and discuss the equipment children will need to have in school to be able to access the full range of OPAL activities available at playtimes/lunchtimes. This is also an opportunity to ask questions relating to the development of OPAL within the school and how it will impact the children. Therefore, we are inviting parents to attend this event (All parents are welcome). Please find details of the event below:


