Throughout November the whole school has taken part in Barvember. Everyone in the school, children to staff, have been answering daily maths word problems using a bar model to help to visualise the problem and answer the question. We hope that using these skills will support our children's mathematical reasoning in their school work and homework.

As part of our drive for mathematical problem solving, we have been unpicking word problems on a Friday. Throughout these sessions we have been using a range of resources to model what the problem looks like both using concrete and pictorial approaches. From there the children have manipulated the questions and developed links between numbers and ideas. Y6 have loved challenging themselves and each other with more complex problems every week.







RNLI Visit!

As we are located in a costal city, we ensure that pupils have the opportunity to learn how to keep safe near water, as part of our personal development curriculum. The RNLI came into school to speak to the children about how to stay safe at the seaside and what the RNLI do. The children listened and were extremely engaged within the sessions. We hope everyone keeps up this amazing effort on TTRockStars to support the development of rapid recall of multiplication facts.













Anti-Bullying Week!






The children have shown staff that they are already making a change within school. We have encouraged the children that this needs to continue outside of school when they are together or when they are on social media.

A focus identified by the Y6 pupils was to look particularly at online bullying.














Key Stage One Performance

Year 1 Beach School

As part of our geography curriculum, we are practically learning about the coastal environment in Sunderland. Year 1 have loved starting Beach School! Although the weather has been variable, we have enjoyed every moment and don't let a bit of wind and rain stop us. Thank you to all our parent volunteers, and look out for our Spring term dates, which will be coming out soon.

We have applied our scientific knowledge of the properties of materials to have a treasure hunt, where children found translucent sea glass, rough shells and smooth stones. We have been looking at landmarks around the world and in Sunderland and then children had a go at building them on the beach, consolidating our design & technology skills. We have had the stadium of light, the Eiffel Tower, Penshaw Monument and many others.





When we come back, we share our learning with the rest of class and we have had lots of creative fun! The whole class planned a new landmark they'd like to build for Sunderland and listed the materials we would need to collect. Some people are building statues of the Lambton Worm, we have sea glass sculptures and some beautiful new bridges.



After building our own sculptures, we investigated the natural sculptures of Andy Goldsworthy, and then had a go at our own natural sculptures outside! Next, we will plan an Andy Goldsworthy natural pattern and then build it with the materials we can find in our surroundings.





Governors Visit to BB!

Governors were invited to join in lessons across the school and discuss with the children the learning that they have been doing so far this term. 

Reducing the spread of diarrhoea and/or vomiting: Advice for parents

What is it?

- Vomiting is easily recognised, but diarrhoea can be less easy to identify.
- Diarrhoea is the passage of more than one abnormally loose bowel motion in 24 hours. The faeces/motion has no solid shape and will take the shape of any container into which it is put.

What causes it?

- The most common cause is a bug called norovirus, which requires no treatment. The diarrhoea and/or vomiting usually lasts 1 2 days.
- Other bugs such as salmonella, cryptosporidium, campylobacter or E.coli O157 can also cause diarrhoea and/or vomiting and can spread from one person to another. These can cause more serious illness.

What should I do?

- Do not send your child to school if they have diarrhoea or vomiting. If your child is unwell with diarrhoea and/or vomiting, pay special attention to hand hygiene in the home.
- If the diarrhoea and/or vomiting is mild, let the illness run its course and give your child plenty of fluids (sips) to prevent dehydration.
- If your child is unusually sleepy, isn't improving after a couple of days, won't take fluids or has other symptoms, such as blood in their diarrhoea, an unusual rash, headache, neck stiffness or difficulty breathing, contact your GP urgently or take your child to hospital.

How are diarrhoea and /or vomiting spread?

- The germs are shed in the vomit and faeces (motions) of those infected and can be spread to other places (taps, other people, food and so on) via hands.
- Germs pass from person to person and through the environment or commonly touched items which have the germs on them.
- Thorough cleaning of the environment/commonly touched items and not sharing towels or utensils is very important to stop the spread of infection.

How can it be prevented?

- Good hand washing is one of the most important ways to prevent the spread of germs. This applies to the child who is ill and anyone looking after them.
- Hands should always be washed using warm water and liquid soap after using the toilet, before eating or handling food and after cleaning up a mess (vomit, faeces or urine) or changing nappies.
- Good hand hygiene is crucial to prevent further spread to others.
- If possible, each household member should have a separate towel for their own personal use.

Exclusion

- If your child has diarrhoea and/or vomiting, keep them off school until they have not had any symptoms for 48 hours
- If your child has been to see the GP and you know what the cause of the illness is, please let the school know as soon as possible.
- Keep your child away from other children and people who are particularly vulnerable (eg the elderly and those with chronic illnesses) until they have not had symptoms for 48 hours.
- Anyone who has been in contact with someone with vomiting and/or diarrhoea but does not have symptoms themselves, may attend school as normal.
