Beach School

(Full time Reception)

Children are continuing to thrive from the explorative, inspiring, and investigative experience of Beach School, where this month they have been searching for treasure. The children have had the opportunity to develop their team working skills, working cooperatively to dig, find, and collect beach treasure. With their bags full of treasure, the children's scientific enquiry skills were put to the test when they were challenged to classify their objects. The children created their own categories, organising their treasure by size, colour, and shape etc. The children then buried their treasure and created treasure maps for the other children to follow in order to find the buried treasure. They supported each other by providing their peers with directional clues.

Anti-Bullying Week

During anti-bullying week the children in EYFS looked at how to be a good friend. The children read stories about the importance of friendship, and they drew their ideas about what it means to be a good friend from what they had heard and read.

"The boy in the story was trying to help the penguin find his home. If you help someone then that's being a good friend."

"The penguin in the story didn't listen to the boy and that's not being a good friend. You've always got to listen to your friends."

"The penguin didn't say thank you to the boy when he helped him find his home. That wasn't being a good friend. You need to remember to say 'thank you' to be a good friend."

The children created various pieces of art work to represent how we are all different, and whilst creating their art work they added positive words and phrases, which they believed represents a good friend. Another story of focus during anti-bullying week was 'Frozen', with the children delving deeper into the message of friendship in the story and how Elsa and Anna don't always make the right choices. The children developed their own 'Frozen' staging and enjoyed creating their own characters, all of who had positive characteristics, which they loved acting out for their peers.



The children have also had lots of fun creating friendship potions. The children wrote their own recipes to include qualities of a good friend, before then creating their potions by adding their own ingredients to correspond with each of the qualities they had come up with.



The Solar System

The solar system has been at the centre of the children's interests this term. This interest stemmed from the children's creations of rockets within our studio, which naturally led to discussions around where these rockets go when they leave earth. Video provocations of the universe were set up within the 'Exploration Space', which immediately ignited the children's curiosity further. The children began sharing their existing knowledge and understanding of the solar system, while others raised questions in order to obtain knowledge and understanding. Books and the internet were used by the children as a source to carry out research in order to find answers to their questions. The children then independently recorded their findings through drawings and writing.
