All parents will be contacted via telephone by their child's class teacher during week commencing 12th October. (This may be extended to w/c 19th October if necessary).


We will text parents prior to their phone call so that they are aware when staff will be ringing.

EARLY YEARS—FOUNDATION STAGE

It has been lovely to have the children back within Early Years! They have settled brilliantly and loved sharing what they have been up to over the six weeks' holidays. We have spent a lot of time outside exploring within our poly tunnel; the children have shown great care and bravery while handling creatures, such as: giant spiders, slugs, snails and caterpillars. We even came back to a surprise as the potatoes we planted early this year had grown into huge spuds! We loved discussing similarities and differences between the potatoes and talking about size; some of them were bigger than our heads!





YEAR 1

Year 1 have settled into KS1 life so well. They have loved exploring their new classroom and outdoor areas, making new friends in their class, and eating lunch in the dining hall. Their topic this term is Me, My Family and My World with the children making family trees and writing about themselves and important family events.

Year 3 are really happy being back at school, playing with our friends in a safe way. We have enjoyed using our practical apparatus to support our Maths learning.




Year 4

The children have settled really well into Year Four and have been working extremely hard! We have been focusing on Ancient Greece and have been looking at ancient Greek myths including Medusa.

The children have worked really hard to write excellent character descriptions.

<u>Medusa</u>

In science, we have been studying plants and the life cycle. The class particularly enjoyed dissecting a flower during one lesson, see photos attached. Year 6 have been exploring how WW2 started, who was involved and researched the geography of the war. Our journalist skills have been put to the test writing for the local newspaper in 1939, stating that war has been declared!



COVID-19 (coronavirus) absence: A quick guide for parents / carers

What to do if	Action needed	Back to school
my child has COVID- 19 (coronavirus) symptoms*	Child shouldn't attend school Child should get a test Whole household self-isolates while waiting for test result Inform school immediately about test results	when child's test comes back negative
my child tests positive for COVID-19 (coronavirus)	Child shouldn't attend school Child self-isolates for at least 10 days from when symptoms* started (or from day of test if no symptoms) Inform school immediately about test results Whole household self-isolates for 14 days from day when symptoms* started (or from day of test if no symptoms) - even if someone tests negative during those 14 days	when child feels better, and has been without a fever for at least 48 hours They can return to school after 10 days even if they have a cough or loss of smell / taste. These symptoms can last for several weeks once the infection is gone.
in my household has COVID- 19 (coronavirus) symptoms*	 Child shouldn't attend school Household member with symptoms should get a test Whole household self-isolates while waiting for test result Inform school immediately about test results 	when household member test is negative, and child does not have COVID-19 symptoms*
in my household has tested positive for COVID-19 (coronavirus)	Child shouldn't attend school Whole household self-isolates for 14 days from day when symptoms* started (or from day of test if no symptoms) - even if someone tests negative during those 14 days	when child has completed 14 days of self-isolation, even if they test negative during the 14 days

NHS Test and Trace has identified my child as a 'close contact' of somebody with symptoms* or confirmed COVID-19 (coronavirus)	Child shouldn't attend school Child self-isolates for 14 days (as advised by NHS Test and Trace) – even if they test negative during those 14 days Rest of household does not need to self-isolate, unless they are a 'close contact' too	when the child has completed 14 days of self-isolation, even if they test negative during those 14 days
we / my child has travelled and has to self- isolate as part of a period of quarantine	Do not take unauthorised leave in term time Consider quarantine requirements and FCO advice when booking travel Provide information to school as per attendance policy Returning from a destination where quarantine is needed: Child shouldn't attend school Whole household self-isolates for 14 days — even if they test negative during those 14 days	when the quarantine period of 14 days has been completed for the child, even if they test negative during those 14 days
we have received advice from a medical / official source that my child must resume shielding	Child shouldn't attend school Contact school as advised by attendance officer / pastoral team Child should shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted and shielding is paused again	when school / other agencies inform you that restrictions have been lifted and your child can return to school again
