Poetry In Motion

National Poetry Day is the annual mass celebration that encourages all to enjoy, discover and share poetry. This year, we celebrated National Poetry Day on 7th October, and the theme was Choice. Classes across school looked at a range of different poets; from Wilfred Owen- a leading poet from the First World War to modern day poets and performers like A.F. Harrold. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring their chosen poet, analysing, interpreting, performing reciting their work. The children produced a range of work in response to the poems they studied- we think you'll agree our display looks fantastic and celebrates their hard work and efforts as well as our love for poetry.



Help us to keep everyone safe!

Please can we ask all parents, grandparents and carers to be considerate to our neighbours when parking outside of school and the surrounding streets. Please make sure that you are not blocking any residents driveways and that you do not double park at any time. It is important for emergency vehicles that roads are accessible.

We would also ask that once children have been dropped off at school, that families move parked cars as soon as possible to help avoid traffic congestion in our neighbouring streets.

Remember that families are now able to drive into the school car park and use the drop of layby. We do ask however that children are of an appropriate age to walk around unsupervised to their entrance door and that families respect the 5mph speed limit.

Can we also remind parents to check that roads are clear before crossing, as cars are now driving in and out of the car park.



Year 5

Year 5 have really enjoyed their art topics so far this term. The children used their IPads to research the colours used on flags and what they

represent. They also researched what animals were commonly used on flags and how they can be used to convey a message. They then used this research along with their knowledge of Anglo-Saxon times to design their own flags. Children paid great attention to detail when sketching their designs. They then explored the properties of acrylic paint and used this to add colour to their completed flag.



Are you eligible for free school meals [different to the meals provided throughout Reception and Key Stage 1]?

Did you know that if you are, the school attracts pupil premium funding which is used to support them to access additional music tuition sessions and to provide access to some after school clubs and residential visits free of charge.

To be eligible you must be in receipt of one of the benefits listed below:

- Income Support
- Income-Based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income, as assessed by the Inland Revenue that does not exceed £16,190 or Guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

Goldsworthy, they have used their hands and various tools to create texture and lines in the clay to replicate leaves and their patterns.

Painting specialists

Year 2 have been using paints to explore primary and secondary colours.

They children enjoyed mixing and combining colours to create new colours and different tints and tones. After lots of investigation they found out that a tint is when a colour gets lighter by adding white and a tone is when a colour gets darker by adding black. The children worked extremely hard and were focused, ensuring their work was neat and that they were adding the right amount of water and colour.



Stone Age Cave Art

Year 3 have been using different painting techniques to create their own version of pre historic cave art. The children have used both thick and thin brushes for different purposes. First, the children used thick brushes to water colour the back ground using big long strokes. Then, we used thin brushes and paint to add detail and create people, animals and symbols. We used the cave art found at the Walls of Lascaux as our

inspirations. Mr Cain has been extremely impressed with the artistic flair of the year 3 class.
