### AFTERSCHOOL CLUB

We are delighted we are able to offer an affordable childcare solution for parents/carers of children attending Benedict Biscop C.E Academy with our Afterschool Club, catering for children from Nursery to Year 6.



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Afterschool Club is located in the Learning Centre from Monday to Friday during term time, running straight from children finishing school until 6 o'clock. Children can be collected anytime from them entering Afterschool Club (3:15pm/3:30pm), up until 6pm.

Afterschool Club operates within the values and guidelines of the school and its emphasis is on providing

good quality play care for your child after a busy day at school, creating a relaxed, calm and homely environment.



The club offers a variety of activities, allowing for children to play, learn and develop.

There is a range of equipment and toys that meet their varying needs, giving children opportunities to read, draw, make and play—we also carry out cooking activities with children. On sunny days children will also be given the opportunity to explore the outdoors. In this environment we encourage the children to

participate in team building activities and sports, building team work skills and selfconfidence.

We also provide children with tea and a light healthy snack, changing this regularly depending on the Children's dietary requirements and enjoyment in certain foods.





### THE ROYAL FAMILY

As part of our History curriculum, Year 4 have been learning all about the Royal family and the 1980s. The children



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have really enjoyed learning about the big events, music, fashion and the exciting inventions from before their time and summarised their findings in a poster. Well done Year 4!

### GARDEN ROOM

This half term, in the Garden Room, the children have been experimenting with colours. They have used pipettes and





spoons to carefully choose their ingredients and watched what happened when they mixed them. This led to investigations using vinegar and bicarbonate of soda. The children made their own colourful liquid mixture using the different colours of

vinegar. The children explored what happened if they added different amounts of powder and what happened if they stirred it.









#### SECONDARY COLOURS

As part of our Art curriculum, Year 1 have created some fabulous pieces of art inspired by Dave Thompson! Before this, we worked on our colour mixing skills, creating secondary colours and different tones, trying to match the colour of the sky. Once we had created our final piece showing Sunderland's seaside, we evaluated it and thought about what we could do a little bit different next time. We then had another go at those sections, we really loved this part of our art!

### **Exploring Artefacts**



To kick start their theme Year Two went to the North East Land,

Sea and Air Museum. The children had a fantastic day exploring different artefacts from the past and present. They got to experience what it was like to sit in a cockpit, army trucks, trams and buses. The children stood under the Vulcan XL 319 which landed in Sunderland Airfield over

10 years ago! They also had the chance to wear some of the



different outfits worn by pilots and make their own paper aeroplanes to race! It was a fantastic starting point for our new topic and I know the children brought a lot away from the experience.





### PLATINUM JUBILEE

On 6th February this year Her Majesty The Queen became the first British Monarch to celebrate 70 years of service to the people of the United Kingdom, the Realms and the Commonwealth. To celebrate this, children carried out many activities and events in school taking a closer look at a specific decade from 1950's to the present day. Children explored significant events both Nationally and Globally, fashion and music trends and technological breakthroughs. #### SIDDHARTHA GAUTAMA

Year 3 have enjoyed the start of their new Theme which is "What I Believe: The right to choose religion and beliefs by exploring religion around the world". In History, we started by researching the origins of Buddhism by looking at the life of Siddhartha Gautama. The children used a range of historical



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sources, such as a<mark>rtwork</mark>, pictures

and written texts, to explore the origins. In Geography, we have begun to investigated different religious sites around the world. The children have used maps, atlases and the internet to find where the religious sites are located. The children have explored what can found and done at the each of the religious sites. We aim to make one of the displays within the classroom look like a travel agents window to promote

the different religious sites around the world.

### HELP US TO KEEP EVERYONE SAFE!

Please can we ask all parents, grandparents and carers to be considerate to our neighbours when parking outside of school and the surrounding streets. Please make sure that you are not blocking any residents driveways and that you do not double park at any time. It is important for emergency vehicles that roads are accessible.

We would also ask that once children have been dropped off at school, that families move parked cars as soon as possible to help avoid traffic congestion in our neighbouring streets. Can we remind parents to check that roads are clear before crossing, as cars are now driving in and out of the car park.

Remember that families are now able to drive into the school car park and use the drop of layby. We do ask however that children are of an appropriate age to walk around unsupervised to their entrance door and that families respect the 5mph speed limit.

### IS YOUR CHILD ELIGIBLE FOR FUNDING?

Are you eligible for free school meals [different to the meals provided throughout Reception and Key Stage 1]?

Did you know that if you are, the school attracts pupil premium funding which is used to support them to access additional music tuition sessions and to provide access to some after school clubs and residential visits free of charge.

To be eligible you must be in receipt of one of the benefits listed below:

- Income Support
- Income-Based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income, as assessed by the Inland Revenue that does not exceed £16,190 or Guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax
  Credit
- Universal Credit
