Curriculum PE and some extra- curricular clubs delivered by specialist PE teacher. Continue to track children termly to identify the least active children across school. Offer catch up swim lessons at the end of term to those children who may not reach the Children in Reception and Year 1 attend weekly Beach School sessions.
