We are very keen to invite



Following this, we will be applying our findings to the Bee-Bot app on IPads in our upcoming Computing lessons.

using books and technology to research recipes and proportions.

Children will learn self defence and have the opportunity to develop their self confidence.




Sports Club - KS1

The children have spent time ordering events and creating timelines, looking at artefacts and figuring out what they might have been used for and writing some wonderful explanations of the fire.

YEAR 6



As part of the Year 6 theme, we visited Beamish to be evacuated to Home Farm. The children experienced what it was like to be in a blackout, where they had to go during an air raid and what it was like to live on a farm in war time. After this experience, we travelled to post- war Britain to see what life was like after the war and understand the impact it had in the 1950s.

CURRICULUM FOCUS – PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

At Benedict Biscop, we have designed a PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT curriculum that is bespoke to the needs of our pupils. We believe our curriculum helps our pupils by giving them the skills and knowledge to help them lead confident, safe, happy, healthy, independent and productive lives.

Our personal development curriculum covers all statutory 'Relationships Education' requirements and also all non-statutory 'Citizenship' guidance, incorporating focuses on fundamental British Values. For example, pupils are taught about 'mutual respect and tolerance', where pupils learn about respecting similarities and differences [such as race and disability], helping our children to question stereotypes and to celebrate the diversity of our communities.

In order to provide pupils with further access to information, if they want to continue their learning outside the classroom, our pupils have been instrumental in the creation of a new reading area within the school hall. Pupils helped to design and created a mural based around Maya Angelou's quote, 'In diversity there is beauty and there is strength'.

During breaks and lunchtimes, we open our hall doors and the children can access the area. It has been lovely seeing children use the area since it opened.

YEAR 1— CLASS 2



Focusing on our Geography theme 'Me, My Family, My World', the children have been learning how to use an Atlas and also looking at different types of maps on our IPads. The children have really enjoyed broadening their knowledge and learning about their own locality and comparing it to other places on the map.







YEAR 3

In year 3 we've started our new theme exploring Over 2000 Years Ago... Stone, Bronze and Iron Age. The children have been exploring historical

sources to understand what life was like in the

Stone Age. We have explored what Stone Age people looked like and what roles they had within their communities. We have also explored historical maps of the Neolithic period to understand where primitive people settled during this time.



YEAR 4

This term our theme has been investigating and gaining understanding of ancient Greek history. As a class we have worked on a wide range of investigations and writes, creating leaflets for the local people of

Sunderland informing them of the ancient Greek influences near them. As well as this we have been building vocabulary, using vocabulary strings to write a setting description of Medusa's lair.



Heritage Award

We have been awarded the Heritage Award from Historic England in recognition of developing a History and Geography curriculum, which celebrates and develops a sense of pride in where we live and allow children to understand their local heritage.

Science Capital Award

We have also been awarded the Science Capital Award in recognition of our achievements in developing a while school approach to Science Capital.

POLITE REMINDER

We would like to remind parents that our car drop off zone is for KS2 children only, as children will walk to class without an adult.
