When children are given the opportunity to large scale mark make, they use their full bodies to support this. not only are they developing their fine motor and creative skills; it's their gross motor development as well. Through the open ended opportunity, children used large muscles movements to leave their marks all around the room.



PENSHAW MONUMENT

Using an iPad as a provocation, children developed an interest in Penshaw Monument and wanting to sculpt their own from clay. This meant children had to develop skills and techniques to roll and mould it to their desired shape and texture. They used tools and water to support their understanding of how to change the state of the clay to suit their need. This prompted conversation to where Penshaw Monument came from and if this was a new or old structure.

Animal Printing

While exploring the animals, children developed an interest in printing with their paw prints using paint.

This sparked conversation around habitats and which countries they think the animals originate from. Children made predictions and enjoyed using an iPad to support their learning.
