



Dear Parents,

It has been wonderful welcoming the children back to school – they have settled extremely well and continue to make us proud.

YOU ASKED AND WE LISTENED – **What is my child learning?** Please find attached your child's Learning Journey for the Autumn Term including the spellings and spelling rules they will be learning in class.

I am also writing to share some information with you about homework, reading and the apps and programmes we use in school. **Your child has been given a password and login details for these apps - they have been stuck in the front of their Reading Diary.** These are the main apps and programmes we use in school and for home learning/homework – it should be used to support your child to independently access their learning resources both in and out of school.

Over the last few years, we have looked to streamline homework to ensure that the learning and consolidation that happens at home is purposeful; we also fully understand that family life can be busy! Below is an outline of weekly homework activities.

We will aim to set homework every **Monday** as follows:

- **Reading** – Collins E-book - aim to read a little every night with diary signed and returned to school in book bag
Library sharing book will also be sent home if your child has visited the Library
- **Phonics** – sounds of the week to be practised at home – these will be uploaded to Showbie in the homework folder
- **Spelling Shed** – Spellings will be shared in the form of assignments linked to spelling rules or lists
- **TTRS/Numbots** – 10 mins daily

All tasks should be completed by every Friday

*****Book bags & reading/homework diaries should come into school on a daily basis*****

Please note that additional homework and learning may be allocated throughout the year depending on the year group.

I have also included some “quick guides” about the apps your child will use in order to further support access at home and completion of homework tasks. I am aware that many of you have used these apps and programmes before, however updates in technology happen so rapidly that these prompts are always useful to have.

If you have any issues accessing these or logging in please contact your child's class teacher. We ask that you are patient and bear with us as we navigate the complex technical difficulties of setting up these logins for the new school year.

Finally, I would like to invite you to a Year 2 “What is my child learning and how can I help?”, workshop which will take place on **Thursday 9th October 2025 at 4pm**. Entry will be via the School Office and the session is designed for parents only.
