Dear Year 6 Parents/Carers,

We would like to remind you of our Year 6 Parent Information Session on **Monday 17th November at 4:00pm** in school.

The purpose of this meeting is to give you an overview of what to expect from the Key Stage 2 SATs that your child will take in May next year.

During the session, we will:

- Explain the structure and purpose of the SATs
- Share example papers for English and Maths
- Discuss how the tests are marked and what the results mean
- Offer practical tips on how you can support your child at home
- Answer any questions you may have

What are KS2 SATs?

SATs (Standard Assessment Tests) are statutory national assessments taken by all Year 6 pupils in England. They measure attainment against the national curriculum and help teachers identify areas where pupils may need extra support.

Your child will sit tests in:

- English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (2 papers)
- English Reading (1 paper)
- Mathematics (3 papers: Arithmetic and two Reasoning papers)

The tests are externally marked, and results are reported as scaled scores, where 100 represents the expected standard. Writing and science are assessed by teachers rather than formal tests. SATs are not pass/fail exams; they provide a snapshot of your child's learning before moving to secondary school.

We hope you can join us for this important session. It will be an excellent opportunity to understand the process and feel confident in supporting your child. If you cannot attend, please let us know and we will endeavour to send out more information via email.
